Burundi Day and Field Visit - An all Day Field Visits Event

The Crop-Livestock Integration Project Field visit

This will be a daylong field visit to the ASARECA crop-livestock integration project at Mawha located about 100 km from Bujumbura City on the Bujumbura - Rutana road towards the Tanzania border. The visit will start at the Mahwa Livestock Research Station where Napier Stunt varieties introduced from Uganda are being multiplied and demonstration of climate smart technologies including small scale irrigation, vegetable nurseries and potato seed production. From the Station delegates will visit Mr. Nsengimana Louis farm, a progressive farmer who, through the ASARECA LFP Crop-livestock integration project has embraced and adopted climate smart technologies for integrating crop and livestock production to improve the overall farm productivity. Technologies adopted include water harvesting and drip irrigation for forage and vegetable production, introduction of forage legumes (Desmodium intortum, Stylosanthes guianensis), fodder trees (Calliandra calothyrsus) and forage grasses (Guatemala and Napier grasses) to increase available feed resources; forage chopper to reduce drudgery in cutting fodder to improve intake and treadle pump for the drip irrigation. He has also adopted composting to increase manure availability as well as improved potato and maize varieties. He is producing his own potato seed on farm. Mr. Sengimana has now increased his milk yield significantly and has opened a milk kiosk at the nearby center where he sell his own milk and collect milk from other farmers for retail selling, providing a market opportunity not only for himself but also to his neighbours. Delegates will be accompanied by the Project PI in Burundi and ASARECA staff, Dr Jean Ndikumana and Dr. Emmanuel Zziwa.

The Potato Project Field Visit

The visit will take delegates on a trip to one of the major Potato growing region of Burundi at Mugongomanga, located about 45 km from the beautiful city of Bujumbura. Delegates will see ASARECA project initiatives on up scaling innovations for quality seed potato production. This project, aims at bridging the productivity gap and making the production of potatoes more profitable and sustainable by addressing the challenges farmers face in their quest for good quality seed potato of consumer-preferred, high yielding varieties. Delegates will be exposed to the potato technologies that are being up scaled in Burundi, including seed plots, positive selection and a nursery for stem cuttings. The project has organized one producer per seed production area for seed supply to the potato small producers, located within a radius of 30 km from the potato farmer group. The visitors will also share with the farmers about the potato success stories. Delegates will be accompanied by the Project PI in Burundi and ASARECA staff, Dr Ivan Rwomushana and Brian Isabirye

The Beans Project Field Visit

Delegates will be treated to a day long trip to the Mwaro Province, Bisoro Commune of Burundi where they will appreciate the beauty of the countryside as they visit an ASARECA project on utilization of Bean Innovations for Food Security and Improved Livelihoods in Burundi. The objective of the project is to promote bean varieties through development of gender-responsive seed systems that integrates ICM options for sustainable improvement of productivity.
